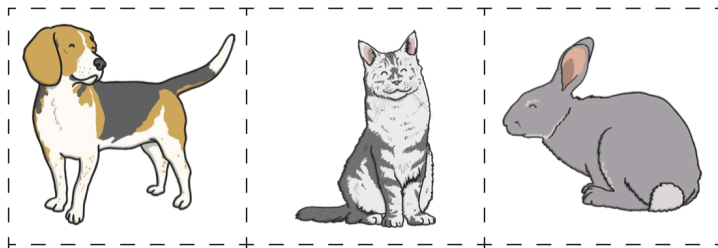

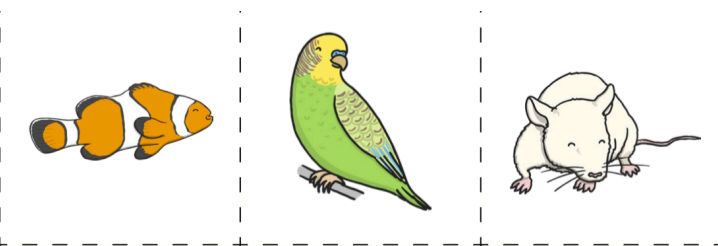
**Action:** to verbally express animals and numbers in French.

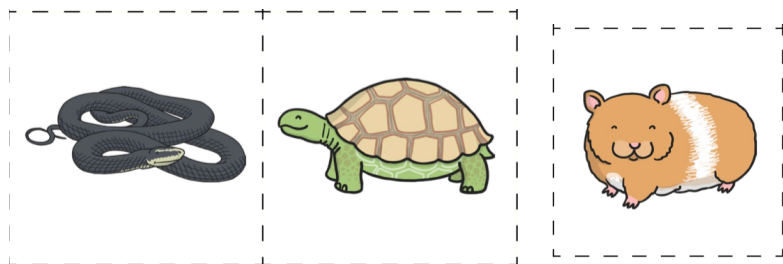







Practice these French words and then have a go at this game with someone in your family:







**You will need:** two battleship grids per person (defending and attacking grids) and a pencil.







**Instructions:** Play this game in pairs. Each player marks their defending grid with three 'ships' (each 'ship' must be three squares long). The first player calls out a grid position in French using the numbers and pictures (e.g. 'neuf chiens'). The other player responds with 'oui' or 'non' depending on whether one of the ships from their defence grid has been hit. If part of your ship is hit, cross that square out. When an entire ship (all three squares) is hit, respond by saying 'c'est terrible!' (this is terrible).

Continue taking turns until one player sinks all their partner's ships.
