COVID guidance for children

Latest Government Covid advice is as follows:

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional. If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower and they can return.

Reception

We have started our new growing topic which we introduced through our "Jack and the Beanstalk" story.

In Science our topic is "sound". We learnt how sound is made and have applied this in our DT topic this term as we are going to design and make a musical instrument using recycled materials.

Year 5

We have enjoyed Geography, comparing the physical and human features of the Cotswold to The Grand Canyon. We blended the colours to show the Grand Canyon in our Art lesson.

Year 6

This week, we have been doing lots of tests to revise for SATS. In PE, we have been focusing on athletics. This week we did running and next we are doing long jump.

In Art, we've been learning about Salvador Dali, a surrealist famous for painting things he saw in his sleep.
