Hello from school

What a busy week! Yr 6 have been busy completing their SATS. Year 5 have been out exploring the local geography and will be going to the Forest Of Dean tomorrow.

The school has been very busy with lots of exciting learning going on. The children have enjoyed being outside in the lovely Spring sunshine and making the most of the Nature Garden and the field.

This May half term, Gloucestershire County Council is providing vouchers to parents who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and is separate to that of the term time free school meals.

Parents who have signed up to the scheme will receive a voucher for £15 for each child who is eligible for FSM which will cover the May half term week. The scheme is eligible for children aged 4-16 years old. Unfortunately, we are unable to consider college and sixth form students.

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register, they have already been included, but to ensure we get all who are eligible, we are encouraging new parents to sign up as soon as they can.

For parents who have already signed up, if more of their children have become entitled to free school meals since they applied, please ask them to contact us so we can update their amount, as this not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers for the February half term period is now open until the 24th May. Voucher emails will be sent out between 25th and 26th May. Please encourage parents to also check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If parents have not received their vouchers by then please encourage them to get in contact with us by emailing childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk with the following details:

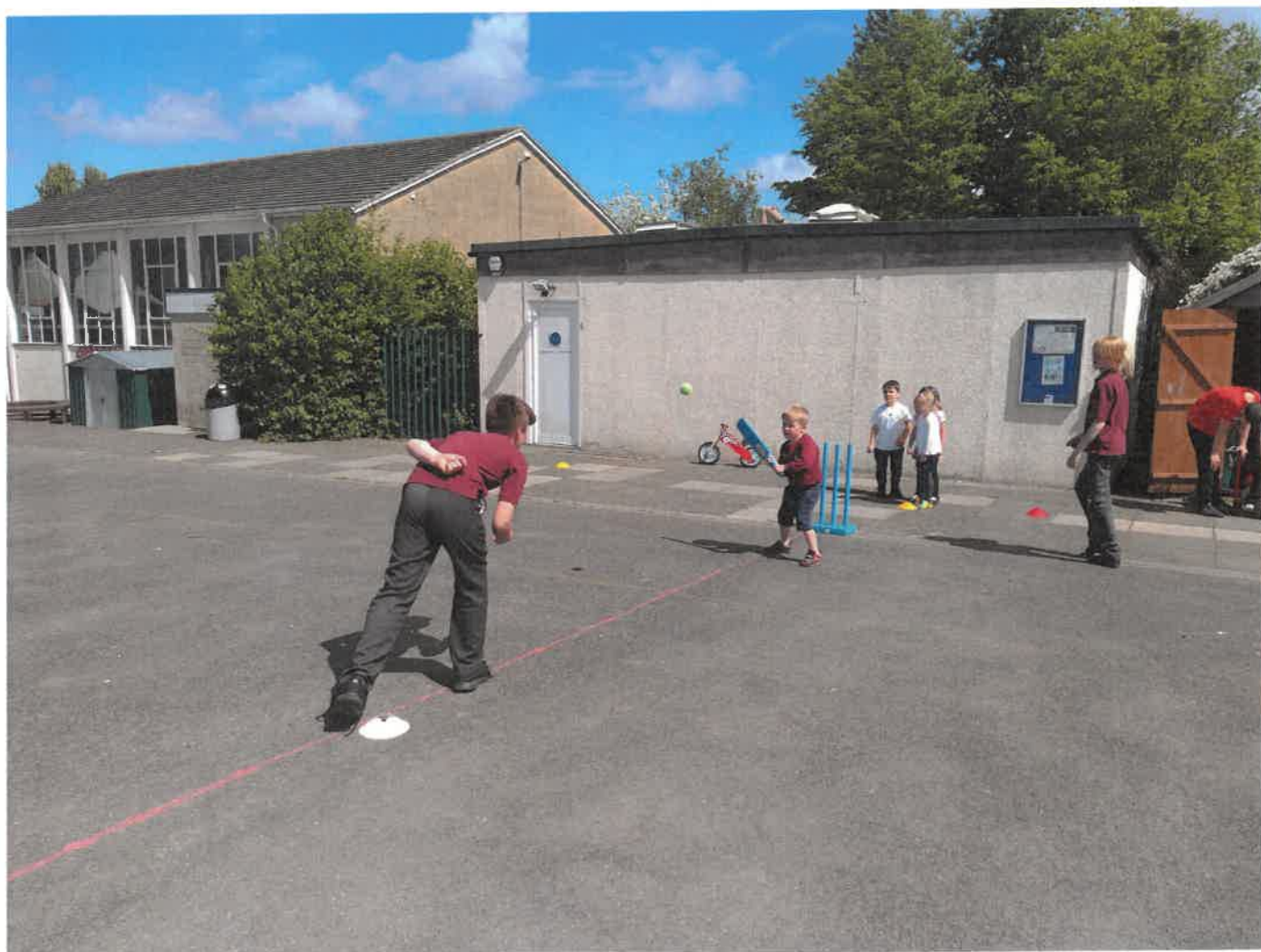
Value Badges

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The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

In 2022, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II will be the first British monarch to have served the UK for 70 years. To celebrate, there will be many Platinum Jubilee events held in the UK and in the **Commonwealth**.



Previous Jubilees

Since 1952, The Queen has celebrated three jubilees. She celebrated 25 years of service in 1977 with a Silver Jubilee and had a Golden Jubilee celebrating 50 years of service in 2002. In 2012, the Thames Diamond Jubilee Pageant had 670 boats float along the river Thames in London as part of The Queen's celebrations for 60 years of service.

Throughout the Year

There will be a tree-planting initiative called The Queen's Green Canopy as part of the Platinum Jubilee. It includes a Junior Forester Award for children who learn about and plant trees during the year.

The Extended Bank Holiday

The main weekend of events will be from the 2nd to the 5th of June 2022. The Trooping the Colour Parade will march down from Buckingham Palace to the grounds of Horse Guards Parade on the 2nd of June. That night, many signal fires will be lit in high positions all across the UK and the Commonwealth.

Next, The Queen will attend a special Service of Thanksgiving in St Paul's Cathedral on Friday. During Saturday, the Royal Family will appear at the **Epsom Downs Derby**. In the evening, there will be a live, televised concert from Buckingham Palace. Members of the public will be able to attend.

The Last Day

On Sunday, there will be over 5000 people outside Buckingham Palace as part of the Platinum Jubilee Pageant. They will include many entertainers, who will perform various entertainment shows.

Did You Know...?

British communities will be invited to hold street parties and barbecues as part of the Big Jubilee Lunch event on Sunday afternoon.

Many people will be talking about The Queen's Platinum Jubilee long after it's finished because of all the fun and exciting events planned.

Commonwealth:	A collection of 54 independent countries with The Queen as the head.
Epsom Downs Derby:	An annual flat race for three-year-old horses, founded in 1780.

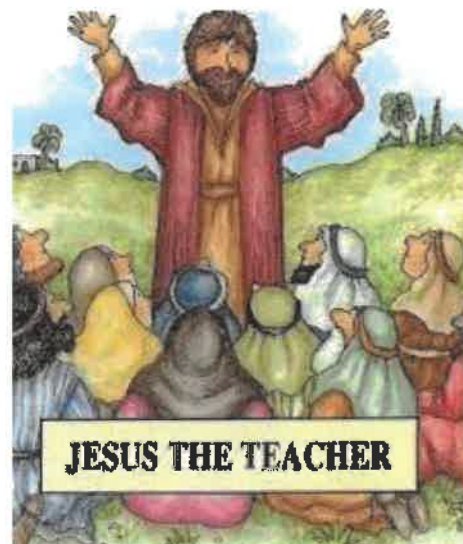
