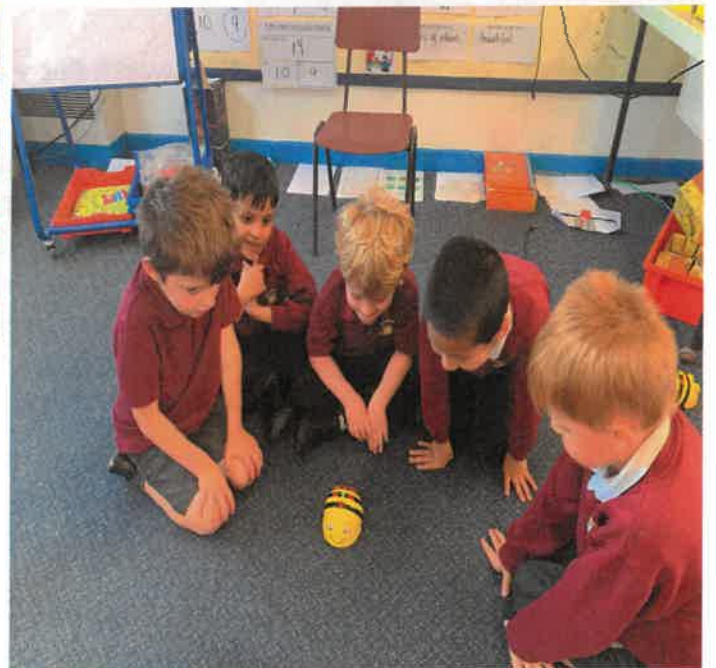
Year 6
