Reception

We've been planting courgettes and tomatoes this week. We've been working in groups, talking about Spring, in preparation for some poetry writing. It's been fun reading Peter Rabbit stories and writing letters to Mr McGregor. We looked at pictures of Peter Rabbit and thought about what might happen next.

Year 1

This week we have been practicing our favourite yoga poses and different types of breathing. We have all taken turns leading breathing time with the breathing ball. Today we made granola, following a recipe we have written in our English lesson.

Year 2

In year 2 we have been learning how to write diary entries. We now know that they are written in the 1st person, using pronouns such as I, we and us. This will lead on to writing fictional diaries from the point of view of a boy involved in the Great Fire of London. We have also been making clay busts of the Queen to be displayed along with work from across the year groups in our Jubilee art exhibition. All of our work will be displayed in St. George's church for the week commencing the 23rd May.

Year 3

This week Year 3 learnt about the plant lifecycle, the different parts of a flower and the process of fertilization and seed dispersal. They had a go at dissecting flowers and identified the petals, anther, stigma and style.

Year 4

This week we have been learning about units of measure. We went into the playground to measure items and compare. We had to estimate how long things were and then check them with a ruler. We have been completing tests and practising our times tables ready for our test in June. Yesterday, we had our last Forest School session with Mrs Wingfield where we made sound sculptures. We are looking forward to our school trip to the Corinium Museum on Friday.

Year 5

Year 5 have been working really hard on our assessments this week. We have also built mechanical hands in DT inspired by the work of Amboise Pare, who was the French surgeon responsible for inventing modern prosthetic limbs. In English we have written reports on life cycles to support our science learning. We are looking forward to the tea party on Friday.

Year 6

We have been given the parts for our Year 6 play so rehearsals will start soon! We've designed our own species in Science. In maths we've learnt about pie charts. We've written about a holiday in French.

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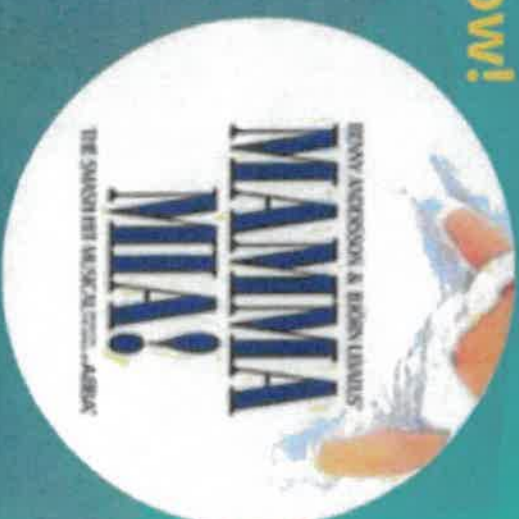

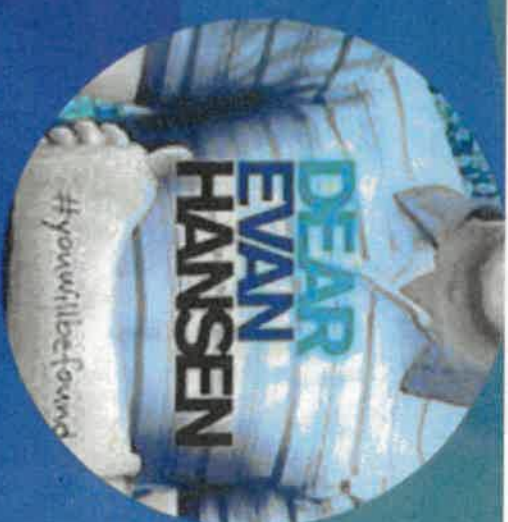
