Phonics Screening

A very well done to year 1 who have done extremely well in their phonics screening this year. We will release the percentage pass rate when it is permissible. Please continue to practise phonics with your child and to listen to them read each night as you have been doing—it makes a huge difference to their learning in all areas.

Reception

In maths we have been learning how to tell the time and we made our own clocks!

It's been great drawing and painting flowers and plants in the nature garden and learning about conservation.

We've started our 'Someone Swallowed Stanley' class story and talked a lot about plastic in the sea.

Year 1

This week we have had great fun looking and comparing toys from the past to toys of the present. They are so different! We also had a great PE session where we practised our activities and running for Sports day. We have been practising our number bonds—ask us at home and we can tell you!

Year 2

Year 2 have had such an exciting week of DT. We have been making prototypes for toy cars and have had to learn some collaboration skills in the process. Working together is not always easy and we have learnt how to be very patient, tolerant and appreciative of other people and their ideas. Alice and Tallulah really improved on their DT skills and collaboration strategies and ended up making one of our star prototypes. A racing car with fully functional axels and wheels!



Year 3

In Art this week Year 3 have been learning all about the Cubism movement. They explored the works of artists Pablo Picasso and George Braque and the principles behind the movement. Next they will be having a go at creating their own Cubism pieces.

Year 4

Last week Y4 has a workshop based on the importance of trees and looking after our local area. It was delivered by Richard and Rachel who work alongside Nailsworth Town Council. We created wigwams using natural (and man made!) material collected in our nature area. We then went to water some newly planted cherry trees across the road from school, which we will be responsible for caring for as a school.

In Science this week, continuing our topic on Sound we made string telephones to explore how sound can travel. Photos below and on the next page.

We have started a poetry entry for the 3 Storeys art gallery. Our poems are all about Nailsworth. I have used metaphors in my poem—Samuel.

I loved doing our computing lesson which was all about programming and using 'if' and 'then' statements. We got to use the iPads and used Scratch to practise our programming—Finlay.

Year 6 are currently enjoying their residential trip to Rockley Park in Poole, Dorset, where they are taking part in lots of fun activities and water sports. They definitely chose the right week to go with all of the glorious weather we have been having!
